Monkeypox

What do so if someone might have Monkeypox

- The infection prevention and control tools currently used are effective for many infectious diseases including Monkeypox.
- Gloves should be used to handle the laundry/linens of anyone who has been diagnosed with Monkeypox.
- People should be assessed by a health care provider to determine if their symptoms are monkeypox related and not attend the emergency department care is not required.

Monkeypox Vaccination

- Toronto Public Health and community partners will be hosting the following Monkeypox vaccination clinics over the next few weeks for at-risk populations. For clinic dates and times please click <u>HERE</u> as well as for Monkeypox vaccine and eligibility information.

COVID-19

- Another resurgence of COVID-19 is anticipated in the fall; preparedness is key to ensuring outcomes.
- The Province and TPH consider congregate living settings, including shelters, high-risk setting. The City continues mandatory masking for shelters, 24-hour respite and 24-hour women's drop-in sites, as outlined in the Directive on masks and personal protective equipment use can be found **HERE.**
- Current provincial guidelines indicate that a positive result from a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) does not require confirmation through PCR testing at a COVID-19 Assessment Centre.

COVID-19 TRANSITION PLAN

- As part of the City's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the need for physical distancing in the shelter system, 65 Dundas St. E. was leased by the City of Toronto for use as a temporary shelter program.
- The City has committed to purchasing the building at 65 Dundas St. E. and is currently in the final stages of completing the acquisition of the property to provide permanent homes for people in need as quickly as possible.
- Starting in September 2022 through to the end of 2023, the shelter program will undertake a phased, gradual closure to ensure all clients are supported while renovations take place. All clients will receive support to move to another shelter or into housing before the closure of the temporary shelter program. - 79% have received first dose!
- 70% are fully vaccinated!
- POS Shelters are at 73% vaccinated
- DOS shelters are at 81% vaccinated!

- 67% are fully vaccinated!
